Mayor Grogan informed Council members and Citizens that First Call has been activated for Patterson residents in response to communication problems. Residents must input their current information with First Call to be contacted in case of an emergency. The Service is provided through the Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, so there is no cost for the City to utilize it.

Mayor Grogan informed the Council that a meeting will be scheduled and held in the near future to discuss the need for a red light on U. S. 90, in response to requests from school bus drivers who have trouble crossing the highway in the vicinity of Lipari Street. The State Department of Transportation will be assessing the need for the light in the area.

Mayor Grogan stated that City Hall has been receiving complaints about residents with bees. The City has an Ordinance governing beekeeping and the requirements that must be adhered to. The Mayor requested the City Attorney to notify those residents informing them of the City's Ordinance.

There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Council, Councilmember Mendoza made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Rentrop to adjourn the meeting. The Council unanimously agreed.
