This notice is intended to inform the customers of the Patterson Water System that they will be receiving a letter in the coming days to inform them that we are still above the acceptable limit for THHM's.

Why do I keep getting letters about THHM's

THHM's are tested every Quarter and last 2 quarters have been below the limit. This grade is based on a running average. So even though our last 2 quarters are below the acceptable limit our running average is still above their limit. It takes time to get these numbers down and the fixes that we have done seem to be helping to improve these numbers every quarter.

What is being done to fix this.

The city has already installed blow off valves on dead-end lines and have started opening some hydrants to keep fresh water in the system. We are also working with state and federal reps to secure funding to complete phase 2 of the water plant and to loop the dead-end water lines we have in the system. As of today 5,000,000 has been secured and we are working to get another 3,000,000 to get everything completed.

What does this mean?

The water is safe to drink and use, and you have no immediate threat.

What do you need to do.

You don't need to do anything. The city as stated above is already working to get this corrected as soon as possible.

If there was ever an immediate threat to the water system, you would be notified immediately.
